

2019 Warren County Fair Market Hog Description Form Instructions

Due May 1st by 4:30 p.m. to the Warren County Extension office.

Instructions:

1. All blanks must be completed.
2. Hogs that will be shown in the County Born Show must include the County Born tag # assigned by the producer on your form.
3. No faxed copies will be accepted. Pictures must be included with this application at time of entry. Pictures can be printed from your home printer as long as they are clear and in color.
4. No late entries accepted after May 3, 2019. Late entries will be charged \$10 per pig entered by the number of days late. Cash only. (Example: 3 pigs entered 2 days late = 3 pigs x \$10 x 2 days = \$60.)
5. A maximum of three pigs may be entered per exhibitor. Only two may be brought to the fair.
6. Steps for completing this form:
 - a. Complete the information about the pigs you are registering for the fair, including sex, county bred status, color and ear notches. Draw the notches on the diagram.
 - b. Take a picture of the hog on the side view with the head visible for identification purposes. Pictures should be clear and the hog should be clean. Unacceptable pictures will be returned and must be done again until acceptable. Pictures should be a minimum of 2" X 3" in size.
 - c. Individual pictures may be attached to the form with the exhibitor's name and the pig's information written on the back of the photo.
 - d. The PREFERRED method for submitting photos is to cut and paste your photos onto one 8½ X 11 sheet of paper per exhibitor. Your photo page can be printed on the back side of the description form (preferred) or stapled to the description form. Write the name of the exhibitor on the top of the sheet and the entry # next to each hog's photo. See the example below.

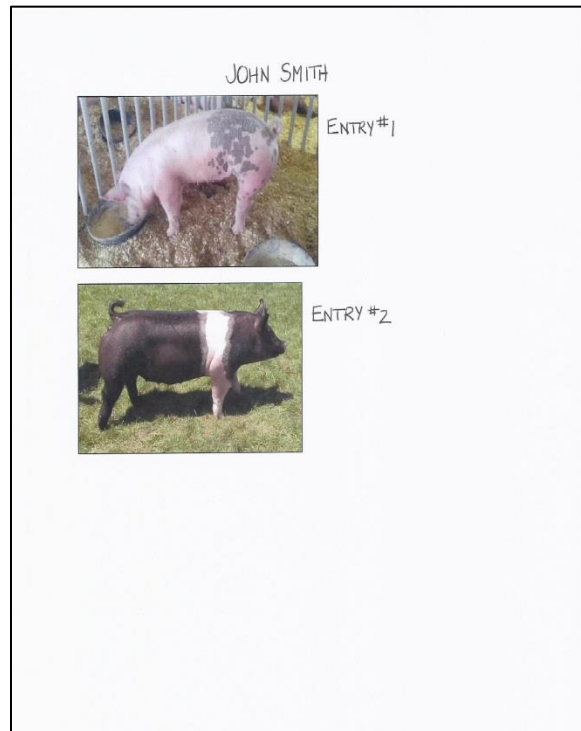

UNIVERSAL EAR NOTCHING SYSTEM
 The Universal Ear Notching System is the most common method of permanent identification for swine. The following paragraphs and diagrams explain the Universal Ear Notching System.
Litter Mark (Right Ear) – The "R" on the Diagram
 The right ear is used for the litter mark. All pigs in the same litter must have the same ear notches in this ear. The right ear is on the pig's own right side.
Individual Pig Mark (Left Ear) – The "L" on the Diagram
 The left ear is used for notches to show a pig's individual number in the litter. Ear pig will have different notches in this ear.
 When listing or reading ear notches, the litter number is listed first and the individual pig number is listed second.

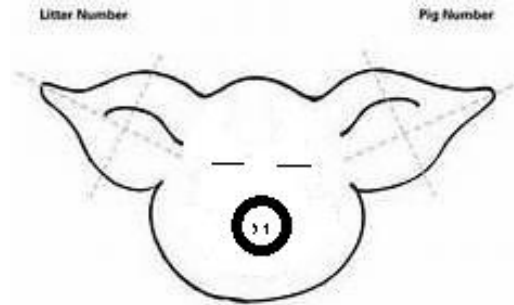

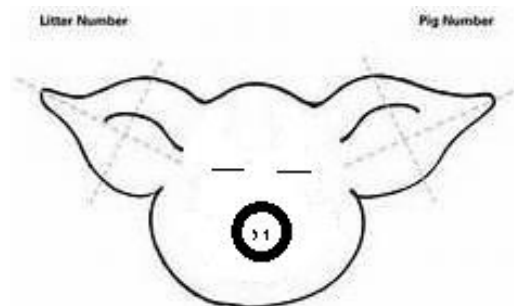

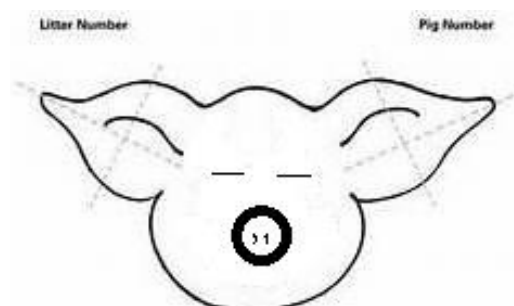

UNIVERSAL EAR NOTCHING SYSTEM

The **Universal Ear Notching System** is the most common method of permanent identification for swine. The following paragraphs and diagrams explain the Universal Ear Notching System.

Litter Mark (Right Ear) – The “R” on the Diagram

The right ear is used for the litter mark. All pigs in the same litter must have the same ear notches in this ear. The right ear is on the pig's own right side.

Individual Pig Mark (Left Ear) – The “L” on the Diagram

The left ear is used for notches to show a pig's individual number in the litter. Ear pig will have different notches in this ear.

When listing or reading ear notches, the litter number is listed first and the individual pig number is listed second.
