4-H Equine Health Records

Below is a list of vaccinations that each animal must have before showing at the current year's Warren County Fair. The following vaccination records must be submitted along with the Equine Project Description Form to the Extension Office by May 31, 2019.

- 1. TETANUS
- 2. INFLUENZA
- 3. ENCEPHALOMYELITIS (EASTERN & WESTERN)
- 4. RHINOPNEUMONITIS
- 5. COGGINS TEST

Each horse must have a Negative Coggins Test taken after July 20, 2018. A copy of the NEGATIVE Coggins Test results should be attached to this sheet. Please be aware that you need the test RESULTS; not just a statement that the blood has been drawn.

These requirements are to protect your animal as well as the other animals at the fair from these extremely contagious diseases. Please attach proof of vaccinations* and return to the Extension office by May 31, 2019. **Receipts for vaccinations must be attached**.

There are other vaccinations that might be advisable, including West Nile Virus. Please ask your vet for their recommendation.

Information about vaccinations, diseases and worming is included in the Beginning Horse Management project book (#174).
